

The Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium will soon distribute a survey that asks you about berries that are important as food to your community. We hope to identify which of the almost 40 species of edible berries in Alaska are valued as food, and whether the abundance of those berries has changed in recent years. This information will help direct research that examines how berries may be affected by climate change.

We are sending you this guide to the more common edible Alaska berries ahead of the survey. This is to help you identify which species may grow near your community. For each of the 16 species of berries in this guide, we provide pictures of the berry and its flower, a map which shows the distribution of that berry in blue, and some of the more common names for that berry. The guide is organized based on the height of the berry plant.

The questionnaire that we distribute will be arranged in the same order as this guide. We hope that this guide will help you distinguish among the species of berries as you complete the questionnaire.
